STATUS OF THE 1992 FUND CONVENTION AND THE SUPPLEMENTARY FUND PROTOCOL

Note by the Secretariat

Summary: At the opening of the 27th session of the 1992 Fund Assembly in October 2022, 120 States will be Parties to the 1992 Fund Convention. At the opening of the 19th session of the Supplementary Fund Assembly, 32 States will be Parties to the Supplementary Fund Protocol. The Member States of the 1992 Fund and Supplementary Fund are set out at the Annex to this document.

Action to be taken: 1992 Fund Assembly and Supplementary Fund Assembly

Information to be noted.

1 1992 Fund Convention

- 1.1 At the opening of the 27th session of the 1992 Fund Assembly in October 2022, 120 States will be Members of the 1992 Fund, as set out at the Annex.
- 1.2 The 1992 Fund Convention entered into force for the Republic of San Marino and the Republic of Costa Rica on 19 April 2022 and 19 May 2022, respectively.
- 1.3 The Republic of Guinea-Bissau acceded to the 1992 Fund Convention on 12 May 2022. The Convention will enter into force for this State on 12 May 2023, bringing the number of 1992 Fund Member States to 121 at that time.

2 Supplementary Fund Protocol

At the opening of the 19th session of the Supplementary Fund Assembly in October 2022, 32 States will be Members of the Supplementary Fund. There have been no further accessions to the Supplementary Fund Protocol since 2018.

3 Action to be taken

1992 Fund Assembly and Supplementary Fund Assembly
