Notice of the Deposit of Instrument of Accession to the 1992 Fund Protocol by Singapore, Grenada and Croatia

In accordance with Regulation 4.6 of the Internal Regulations of the International Oil Pollution Compensation Fund 1992 (1992 Fund), the Director has the honour to notify Contracting States that instruments of accession to the Protocol of 1992 to amend the International Convention on the Establishment of an International Fund for Compensation for Oil Pollution Damage, 1971 (1992 Fund Protocol), were deposited by Singapore, Grenada and Croatia on 31 December 1997, 7 January 1998 and 12 January 1998, respectively. The 1992 Fund Protocol will enter into force for Singapore on 31 December 1998, for Grenada on 7 January 1999 and for Croatia on 12 January 1999.

The 30 States which have deposited instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession in respect of the 1992 Fund Protocol are listed overleaf.
