#### ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

#### **Note by the Director**

Summary: In accordance with Resolution N°5, the Assembly should elect 15 States as

members of the Executive Committee.

Action to be taken: Election of States to the Executive Committee.

#### 1 Introduction

In accordance with Resolution  $N^{\circ}5$  adopted by the Assembly at its 2nd session in 1997, the Assembly shall elect 15 members to the Executive Committee, to hold office until the end of the next regular session of the Assembly.

#### **2** Composition of the Executive Committee

- 2.1 Pursuant to Resolution N°5, the election of the Executive Committee is governed by the following provisions:
  - (a) Seven Executive Committee members shall first be elected from among the eleven Member States in the territory of which the largest quantities of oil to be taken into account under Article 10 of the 1992 Fund Convention were received during the preceding calendar year.
  - (b) Eight members shall then be elected from the other Member States.
  - (c) A Member State which was eligible but was not elected under sub-paragraph (a) shall not be eligible for any remaining seat on the Committee.
  - (d) The Assembly shall, when electing the members of the Committee, secure an equitable geographical distribution of the seats on the Committee on the basis of an adequate representation of Member States particularly exposed to the risks of oil pollution and of Member States having large tanker fleets. The Assembly may also take into account the extent to which a particular State has fulfilled its obligation to submit reports on receipts of contributing oil, in accordance with Article 15 of the 1992 Fund Convention.

- (e) Members of the Executive Committee shall hold office until the end of the next regular session of the Assembly.
- (f) Except to the extent that may be necessary to comply with the requirement set out under (a) above, no State may serve on the Executive Committee for more than two consecutive terms. However, if a State eligible under (a) declares before the election that it might not be able to attend the Committee's sessions, the Assembly may elect in its place another State from among the eleven States eligible under (a), even if the latter State has served for two consecutive terms.
- 2.2 At its 10th session the Assembly elected the following States as members of the Executive Committee, to hold office until the end of the next regular session of the Assembly (document 92FUND/A.10/37, paragraph 24):

#### 3 Eligibility for election

- 3.1 Information on the 2005 figures for contributing oil receipts is given in Annex I. With respect to those States which had not submitted their reports on the 2005 receipts at the time of the drafting of this document, the last year in respect of which a report was submitted is given, as indicated in the table. For States which had not submitted any reports since joining the 1992 Fund, the latest report submitted to the 1971 Fund, if any, has been used.
- 3.2 On the basis of the reports on contributing oil receipts submitted by 9 October 2006, the Member States which will be eligible are as follows (seven States to be elected under paragraph (a) and eight States under paragraph (b)):

- For the purposes of paragraph (d) of Resolution N°5 quoted above, information on the oil tanker fleets of Members States as at 31 December 2005 is given in Annex II.
- 3.4 Resolution N°5 provides that States elected to the Executive Committee shall hold office until the end of the next regular session of the Assembly. It is also provided that a member may not serve

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on the Committee for more than two consecutive terms, except to the extent necessary to comply with the eligibility requirements.

- 3.5 Of the 11 States eligible under paragraph (a), Italy, the Republic of Korea and the United Kingdom have been members of the Executive Committee for two consecutive terms and should therefore not be elected. Of the 85 States eligible under paragraph (b), Algeria, China (Hong Kong Special Administrative Region), Finland, Portugal, the Russian Federation and Uruguay have been members of the Committee for two consecutive terms and therefore should not be elected.
- 3.6 It should be noted that paragraph (f) of Resolution N°5 provides that if a State eligible under paragraph (a) declares before the election that it might not be able to attend the Committee's sessions, the Assembly may elect in its place another State from the eleven States eligible under that paragraph, even if the latter State has served for two consecutive terms.

### 4 Action to be taken by the Assembly

The Assembly is invited to elect 15 members of the Executive Committee.
