APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTOR

PROCEDURES FOR RECRUITMENT

Note by Ireland

Summary:	This document contains a proposal to the effect that, in the event of their being more than six applicants for the post of Director of the 1992 Fund, a Committee should be set up to screen the applications.
Action to be taken:	Consider whether a screening committee should be set up to examine applications.

- 1 A difficulty could arise in the event of a large number of persons applying for the post of Director of the 1992 Fund. In theory each Member State could sponsor a different applicant. This would be very difficult for the 1992 Fund Assembly to manage. In order to overcome possible difficulties the following arrangement is suggested.
 - 2 Should the number of applicants exceed six a screening committee should examine the applications with a view to reducing the number for consideration by the 1992 Fund Assembly to five; the screening committee to be comprised of the current Director and the Chairmen of the governing bodies (excluding any of those who may themselves be applicants).
 - 3 **Action to be taken by the governing bodies**
 - 3.1 The 1992 Fund Assembly is invited to consider, in the event that more than six candidates apply for the post of Director of the 1992 Fund, whether a screening committee comprising of the current Director and the Chairmen of the governing bodies should be set up to examine the applications.
 - 3.2 The 1971 Fund Administrative Council is invited to take note of the information contained in this document.
