ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Note by the Director

Introduction

- 1 Under Article 18.8 of the 1971 Fund Convention, the Assembly shall elect the Member States to be represented on the Executive Committee.
- The Executive Committee consists of one third of the Member States, but of not less than seven or more than fifteen. If the number of Member States is not divisible by three, the one third referred to is calculated on the next higher number which is divisible by three (Article 22.1).
- 3 When electing the members of the Executive Committee, the Assembly shall, under Article 22.2:
- (a) secure an equitable geographical distribution of the seats on the Committee on the basis of an adequate representation of Member States particularly exposed to the risks of oil pollution and of Member States having large tanker fleets; and
- (b) elect one half of the members of the Committee, or if the total number of members to be elected is uneven, such a number of the members as is equivalent to one half of the total number less one, among those Member States in the territory of which the largest quantities of contributing oil were received during the preceding calendar year, provided that the number of States eligible under this sub-paragraph is limited as shown in a table set out in Article 22.2(b).

A Member State which was eligible but was not elected under sub-paragraph (b) above shall not be eligible to be elected for any remaining seat on the Executive Committee (Article 22.3).

Composition of the present Executive Committee

The present members of the Executive Committee, elected at the 19th session of the Assembly, hold office until the end of the 20th session of the Assembly, in accordance with Article 23.1 of the 1971 Fund Convention. Composition of the new Executive Committee

- At the time of the 20th session of the Assembly, the 1971 Fund will have 74 Members. Fifteen Members of the Assembly have therefore to be elected to the Executive Committee. Seven Members have to be elected in accordance with Article 22.2(b), and eight Members in accordance with Article 22.2(a). As regards the election of the Members under Article 22.2(b), the eleven Members with the largest quantities of contributing oil reported are eligible.
- On the basis of the reports on contributing oil receipts submitted by 30 July 1997, the Member States are eligible as follows:

- Article 23.2 of the 1971 Fund Convention provides that no Member may serve on the Executive Committee for more than two consecutive terms of office, except to the extent that this may be necessary to comply with the requirements of Article 22.
- 8 Of the 63 States eligible under Article 22.2(a), Finland, Nigeria and the Russian Federation have been members of the Executive Committee for two consecutive terms and should therefore not be elected. Of the 11 States eligible under Article 22.2(b), Australia, Canada, Germany, Netherlands and Spain have been members of the Executive Committee for two consecutive terms. In order to comply with the requirement of Article 22 that eight States shall be elected from the 11 States in this category, it will therefore be necessary for two of these five States to be elected for a third consecutive term.
- According to Rule 41 of the Rules of Procedure of the Assembly, ballots shall first be held for the election of the seven members under Article 22.(b). Thereafter, ballots shall be held for the election of the remaining eight members under Article 22.2(a).
- Information on the 1996 figures for contributing oil receipts is given in Annex I. With respect to those States which had not submitted their reports on the 1996 receipts at the time of the drafting of this document, the last year in respect of which a report was submitted is given, as indicated in the table.
- 11 With reference to the election of members under Article 22.2(a), information on the oil tanker fleets of Member States as at 31 December 1996 is given in Annex II.
- 12 It should be noted that 24 of the 74 Member States of the 1971 Fund have deposited instruments of denunciation in respect of the 1971 Fund Convention. These 24 States will cease to be Members of the 1971 Fund after 15 May 1998.
- As mentioned in the Agenda of this session (document 71FUND/A.20/1, paragraph 30), the Assembly may wish to consider holding an extraordinary session in the spring of 1998 to consider certain issues resulting from the compulsory denunciation of the 1969 Civil Liability Convention and 1971 Fund Convention by 1992 Fund Member States, which will take effect from 15 May 1998.

Action to be taken by the Assembly

14 The Assembly is invited to elect new members of the Executive Committee.
