ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Note by the Director

- The present members of the Executive Committee, elected at the 7th session of the IOPC Fund's Assembly, hold office until the end of the 8th session of the Assembly, in accordance with Article 23.1 of the Fund Convention. Members of the present Executive Committee are France, Federal Republic of Germany, Italy, Netherlands and United Kingdom, elected under Article 22.2(b) of the Fund Convention, and Finland, Gabon, Indonesia, Kuwait and Sri Lanka, elected under Article 22.2(a). The Assembly is invited to elect new members of the Executive Committee who shall hold office until the end of the next regular session of the Assembly.
- At the time of the 8th session of the Assembly, the IOPC Fund will have 31 Members. Therefore, according to Article 22.1 of the Fund Convention, 11 Members of the Assembly have to be elected to the Executive Committee. Five Members have to be elected in accordance with Article 22.2(b) of the Fund Convention, and six Members in accordance with Article 22.2(a).
- Article 23.2 of the Fund Convention provides that no Member may serve on the Executive Committee for more than two consecutive terms of office, except to the extent that this may be necessary to comply with the requirements of Article 22 of the Fund Convention. Finland and Gabon, eligible under Article 22.2(a) of the Fund Convention, as well as Federal Republic of Germany, Italy and Netherlands, eligible under Article 22.2(b), have been members of the Executive Committee for two consecutive terms.
- According to Rule 41 of the Rules of Procedure, ballots shall first be held for the election of the five members under Article 22.2(b). Thereafter ballots shall be held for the election of the remaining six members under Article 22.2(a).

- As regards the election of the members under Article 22.2(b), the eight Members with the largest quantities of contributing oil reported are eligible. The information on the 1984 figures for contributing oil receipts is given in Annex I. With respect to those States which had not submitted their reports on the 1984 receipts at the time of the drafting of this document, the 1983 figures or, in respect of two States, 1982 figures are given.
