## ANNEX

PROVISIONAL RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR THE ASSEMBLIY OF THE INTERRNATIONAL OIL POLLUTION COMPENSATION FOND

## Definitions

Rule 1
For the purpose of these Rules the word "Convention" means the International Convention on the Establishment of an International Fund for Compensation for Oil Pollution Damage, 1971, the word "Member" means a Contracting state to the Convention and the word "Fund" means the International Oil Pollution Compensation Fund.

## Sessions

Rule 2
Sessions of the Assembly shall be held in conformity with Article 19 of the donvention. The Director shall inform Members of the opening date of each regular session at least sixty days in advance and of each extraordinary session at least 30 days in advance.

## Hule 3

The Lssembly shall normally hold its sessions at the headquarters of the Fund. The Assembly may decide to hold its sessions in any place other than the headquarters.

Rule 4
The Director with the approval of the Executive Comittee shall invite States which have sjegned the Convention or which have deposited the appropriate instrument in respect of the Convention, but for which the Convention is not yet in force to send observers to sessions of the Assembly, and such obsorvers upon invitation by tho Chairuon and with the consont of tho Locoubly or its mubcidiary body concerned, nay porticipate without vote on : x.ttors of direct concern to then.

Rule 5
The Director shall invite to be represented by observers at any session of the Assembly:
(i) the United Nations;
(ii) the Inter-Govermmental Maritime Consultative Organization;
(iii) any other specialised agency of the United Nations whose interests and those of the Fund are of common concern;
(iv) any inter-govemmental organization, other than the specialized agencies of the United Nations, with which an agreement or apecial arrangement has been made; and
(v) any non-govermmental intemational organization which the Assembly or the Executive Committee has decided to admit into special relationship with the Fund in accordance with Article 18(10) of the Convention.

Rule 6
Observers may, upon invitation by the Chairman and with the consent of the Assembly, participate without vote in the deliberations of the Assembly in watters of direct concern to them. They shall have access to non-confidential documents and to such other documents as the Director, with the approval of the Chairman, may decide may be made available.

## Delegations

Rule 7
Each Member of the Assembly shall designate a representative, and may also designate alternates and such advisers and experts as may be required.

Rule 8
Upon designation by a representative, the Chairman may allow any other member of the representative's delegation to speak on any particular point at any meeting of the $\Lambda$ ssembly.

Credentials
Rule 9

Fach Member shall transmit to the Director; the credentials of its representative, together with the names of any alternates or other members of its delegation not leiber than the opening day of the Assembly. The credentials shall be issued by the Head of State or by the Head of Government or by the Minister for Foreign Affains or other appropriate authority as determined by the Government and cormunicated to the Director.

Rule 10
The Director shall examine the credentials of delegations and report to the Asserbly without delay.

Rule 11
Any representative to whose admission a Member has made objection shall be seated provisionally with the same rights as other representatives until the Assembly has given its decision on the report of the Director on credentials.

## Publicity

Rule 12
Sessions of the hssembly shall be held in public unless the Assembly decides othervise. Meetings of subsidiary bodies of the Assembly shall be held in private unless the Assembly decides otherwise in any particular case.

## Agenda.

Rule 13
The provisional agenda of each session of the Assembly shall be prepared by the Director end submitted to the Chairman for approval prior to issue.

Rule 14
The provisional agenda of each regular session of the Assembly shall include in addition to those item required by the application of Article 18 of the Convention:
(i) all itens, the inclusion of which has been requested by the Assenbly at a previous session;
(ii) all items the irclusion of which has been requested by the Executive Comittee;
(iii) ail recomendations made by the Executive Comaittee;
(iv) any iten proposed by a Member of the Fund;
(v) an iten on matters pertaining to the budget, accounts and financial arrangenents of the Fund;
(vi) subject to such prelininary consultations as may be necessary, any itei proposed by any of the specialized agencies of the United Hations.

Rule 15
The provisional agenda together with supporting documents for each session shall nomally be comunicated by the Director to the Members at least forty-five days before reguilar. sessions and thirty days before extraordinary sessions.

Rule 16
The first iten on the provisional agenda for each session shall be the adoption of the agenda.

Rule 17
Any iten of the agenda of a session of the Assembly, consideration of which has not been completed at that session, shall be included automatically in the agende of the next session unless otherwise decided by the Assembly.

Rule 18
In exceptional circumstances the Director may, after consultation with the Chaiman, include any other question which may arise between the despatch of the provisional agenda and the opening day of the session, in a supplenentary provisional agenda which the Assombly shall examine together with the provisional agenda. The Director shall advise Members immediately of tho intontion to include an itom in a supplementary provisional agenda.

Rule 19
The Director shall report to the $\Delta$ asembly on any administrative, financial and legal implications of all substantive agenda items subritted to the Assembly, before they are considered by that body. Unless the Assenbly decides otherwise, no such iten shall be considered until the $\Lambda$ ssombly has been in possession of the Director's report for at least forty-eight hours.

## Chaiznen and Vice-Cheirmen

Rule 20
The Assembly shall at the first neeting of each regular session olect a Chaiman, a first Vice-Chairman and a second Vice-Chairman from among the representatives of its Members.

Rule 21
Lt the opening of each regular session of the $\Delta$ ssembly, the represontative of the delegation from which the Chairnan of the previous regular session was elected shall preside until the Assembly has elected a Chairmen for the session.

Rule 22
If the Chairman is absont from a meeting, or any part thereof or, for any reason, is unable to carry out his duties until the expiry of his term of office, one of the Vice-Chairmen shall act as Chairman.

Rule 23
A Chairman or a Vice-Chairman acting as Chairman shall not vote but he may appoint another menber of his delegation to act as the representctive of his Government in plenary meetinge.

## Subsidiary Bodies

Rule 24
The Lascembly nay establish such temporary or permanent subsidiary bodies as it considers necessary. Such subsidiary bodies shall follow the present Rules of Irocedure so for as they are applicable.

## Secrotariat

Iule 25
The Director shall act as Secretary of the Lasenbly and of its subsidiaxy bodies and shall be responsible for andeing the necessory arrangenenta for their neetings. He may delegate his functions to a nember of the Secretariat.

Tule 26
The Director or a nember of the Secretariat designated by hin for the purpose may make either oral or written statements concerning any question under consideration.

Rule 27
The Secretariat sholl prepare reports of the sessions of the Lssenbly incorporating the docisions taken.

Rule 28
It shall be the duty of the Secretariat to receive, translate and circulate to llombers all reports and other documents of the Assembly and its subsidiary bodies.

Langusees

The official and working languages of the Fund are English and Fronch.

Rule 30
Speeches at the Assenbly and its subsidiary bodies ahall be nade in one of the official langunges and will be interpreted into the other official language.

Rule 31
All reports of the hssembly and its subsidiary bodies and all supporting docunents to agenda itens of the Assenbly and its subsidiary bodies sholl be issued in the official languages.

## Voting

Pule 32
Subject to the relevant provisions of Article 33 of the Convention, decisions of the $\Lambda$ ssembly and of its subsidiacy bodies shall be made, elections, including those subject to the provisions of Article 22 of the Convention, determined, and reports, resolutions and reconnendations adopted by a rajority of the Meubers present and voting.

Rule 33
Each Menber shall have one vote. For the purposes of Article 32 of the Convention and of these Rules:
(i) the phrase "iforbers present" neans "Fenbers present at the neeting at the tine of the vote";
(ii) the phrase "Merbers present and voting" means "Members present and casting an affimative or nogntivo vote". Mombors who abstain fron voting shall be considered as not voting.

Rule 34
The Lsserbly shall nomally vote by show of hands. However, any Merbor ayy request a roll-coll which shall be taken in the alphabetical order of the nnues of the Meubers in Finglish, beginning with the Herrer whose noze is drown by lot by the Chairman.

Rule 35
The vote of each Merber participating in any roll-call shall be inserted in the report of the seetint concemed.

Rule 36
If a vote is equally divided, a second vote shall be taken at the next neeting. If this vote also is equally divided, the proposel shall be regarded as rejected.

Fule 37
Elections shall be decided by secret ballot unless the Assembly decides otherwise.

Rule 38
In a secret ballot two scrutineers shall, on the proposal of the Chairman, be appointed by the $\Lambda s s e n b l y$ from the delegations preaent and shall proceed to scrutinize the votes cast. All invalid votes cast shall be reported to the Assembly.

Rule 39
If one person or Menber only is to be elected and no candidate obtains a najority in the first ballot, a second ballot shall be taken confined normally to the two candidates obtaining the largest number of votes. If in the second ballot the votes are equally divided the election shall be deferred until the next meeting, when if another tie results, the Chairman shall decide between the candidates by drawing lots.

## Rule 40

(a) When two or more places are to be filled by election at one tine under the same conditions, those candidates obtaining the najority required under Rule 32 in the first ballot shall be declared elected.
(b) If the number of candidates obtaining the requisite majority is greater than the muber of seats to be filled, those candidates obtaining the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.
(c) If the number of candidates obtaining the requisite majority is less than the number of persons or Mernbers to be elected, there shall be an additional ballot or ballots, as necessary, to fill the remaining places, the voting being restricted to the candidates obtaining the greatest number of votes in the previous ballot and the number of candidates being not nore than twice as many as the places remaining to be filled. Should the same number of votes be obtained, however, by two or nore candidates for the last place in this restricted list, they shall all be placed on the list.

(d) If two or more candidates obtain the same number of votes for the last seat or seats to be filled, there shall be a further ballot among these candidates only. Should the votes again be divided equally, the Chairman shall draw by lot the name of the candidate to be eliminated in the subsequent ballot.
(e) $A$ voting paper containing the names of a greater number of candidates than the number required to be elected shall be considered invalid.

Rule 41
For the elections to the Executive Comittee, to be held in accordance with Articles 22 and 23 of the Convention, ballots shall first be held for the election of candidates under Article 22(2)(b). Thereafter ballots shall be held for the election of candidates to the remaining seats on the Executive Comittee.

## Conduct of Business

Rule 42
A majority of the Members shall constitute a quorum for the meetings of the Assembly.

Rule 43
In addition to exercising the powers conferred upon him elsewhere by these Rules, the Chairman shail declare the opening and the closing of the session of the Assembly. He shall direct the discussion and ensure observance of these Rules, accord the right to speak, put questions to the vote and announce deciaions resulting from the voting.

Kulle 44
Proposals and amendments shall normally be introduced in writing and handed to the Director who shall circuiate copies to delegations. As a general rule, no proposal shall be discussed or put to the vote at any meeting of the Assembly unless copies of it have been circulated to delegations not later than the day preceding the meeting. The Chairman may, however, permit the discussion and consideration of amendments or of motions as to procedure even though these amendments and motions have not been circulated or have only been circulated the same day.

Hole 45
The Assembly may on the proposal of the Chairman limit the time to be allowed to each apeaker on any particular subject under discussion.

Rule 46
During the discussions of any matter a representative of a Member may rise to a point of order and the point of order shell be decided immediately by the Chairman, in accordance with these Rules of Procedure. A representative of a Member may appeal against the ruling of the Chairman. The appeal shall be put to the vote immediately and the Chairman'a ruling shall stand unless overruled by a majority of the Members present and voting.

A representative rising to a point of order may not speak on the substance of the matter under discussion.

Fule 47
Subject to the provisions of Fule 43 the following motions shall have precedence, in the order indicated below, over all other proposala or motions before the meeting:
(a) to suspend a meeting,
(b) to adjoum a meeting,
(c) to adjourn the debate on the question under discussion, and
(d) for the closure of the debate on the question under discussion.

Permission to speak on a motion failing within (a) to (d) above shall be granted only to the proposer and in addition to one apeaker in favour of and two against the motion, after which it shall be put immediately to the vote.

## Pule 48

If two or more proposals relate to the same question, the Assenbly, unless it decides otherwise, shall vote on the proposels in the order in which they have been submitted.

RuIe 49
Parts of a proposal or amendment thereto shall be voted on separately if the Chairman, with the consent of the proposer, so decides, or if any representative of a Member requests that the proposal or amendment thereto be divided and the proposer raises no objection. If objection is raised,
permission to speak on the point shall be given first to the mover of the motion to divide the proposal or amendment, and then to the mover of the original proposal or anondment under diacussion, after which the motion to divide the proposal or amendment shall be put immediately to the vote.

Rule 50
Those parts of a proposal which have been approved shall then be put to the vote as a whole; if all the operative parts of the proposal or amendment have been rejected, the proposal or amendment shall be considered to be rejected as a whole.

Frule 51
A motion is considered to be an amendment to a proposal if it merely adds to, deletes from or revises part of that proposal. An amendment shall be voted on before the proposal to which it relates is put to the vote, and if the amendment is adopted, the amended proposel shall then be voted on.

Rule 52
If two or nore amendments are noved to a proposal, the Assenbly shall first vote on the amendment furthest removed in substance from the original proposal and then on the amendment next furthest recoved therefrom and so on until all amendments have been put to the vote. The Chairman shall determine the order of voting on the anendments under this fule.

## Rule 53

A motion may be withdrawn by its proposer at any time before voting on it has begun, provided that the notion has not been anended or that an amendment to it is not under discussion. $\Delta$ motion withdrawn may be reintroduced by any Member.

Fule 54
When a proposal has been adopted or rejected, it nay not be reconsidered at the same session of the Msserbly unless the $\Lambda$ sesembly, by a majority of the Merbers preaent and voting, decides in favour of reconsideration. Permission to speak on a notion to reconsider shall be accorded only to the mover and one other supporter and to two speakers opposing the motion, after which it shall be put imnediately to the vote.

These Fules of Procedure may be anended by a deciaion of the Assembly taken by a najority of the Members present and voting.

Ovorriding Authority of the Convention
Tule 57
In the event of any conflict between any provision of these Fules and any provision of the Convention, the Convention shall prevail.
